Sacha Klein, PhD, MSW, is an Assistant Professor at the School of Social Work at MSU where she teaches child welfare, social policy, and community and organizational leadership. Her research focuses on child abuse prevention; early care and education for maltreated children; racial/ethnic disparities in child welfare involvement; and neighborhood effects on parenting.

Marci Mechtel, DNP, MSN, RN, ACCNS-P, is an Assistant Professor for the MSU College of Nursing She obtained her Bachelors in Nursing in 1988 and a Master's degree focusing in Nursing Education in 2006, both from Michigan State University. She obtained her Doctor of Nursing Practice from Rush University in Chicago in 2016 with a Pediatric Clinical Nurse Specialist Concentration. She is certified as an Acute Care Clinical Nurse Specialist-Pediatrics, which covers both primary and acute care.

Karlin Tichenor, PhD, LLMFT, is a clinical scholar. As a researcher, he has investigated the Promoting Academic Success Program (PAS) for minority males and the efficacy of this program on the matriculation of these students from high school and post-secondary education. He received his undergraduate degree in 2009 from Denison University in Communication Arts with a minor in Psychology as a scholar-athlete, later receiving his Master of Arts degree, with a specialization in Marriage and Family Therapy from Michigan State University in 2011.

Jane Turner, MD, FAAP, professor in the department of Pediatrics and Human Development at MSU and assistant medical director of the Office of Medical Affairs (Medicaid) and chief medical consultant for Children's Special Health Care Services, Michigan Department of Community Health. She received her BA from Harvard University, her medical degree from University of Oregon and completed her residency in pediatrics at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh.
