SCHOOL OF NURSING RESEARCH DAY 2019: Innovation at the Interface of Knowledge Development and Equitable Care April 9, 2019

This year's Research Day theme was nurse's roles in leading change in health care systems with a focus on technology innovations. The Suzanne H. Brouse Lecture keynote address was presented by Nancy P. Hanrahan, Ph.D., RN, FAAN, executive director of Innovation and Entrepreneurship at the University of Massachusetts-Boston. Dr. Hanrahan emphasized the potential of nurses to disrupt the health care landscape through their unique perspective and deep knowledge of patients' care needs as well as their ability to solve complex challenges. She presented intriguing examples of helping students to create technology innovations in her classes. Dr. Hanrahan was followed by an interdisciplinary panel discussion centered on how innovation and technology can be used to improve the health and wellbeing of vulnerable populations, with a focus on young adults. Panelists were Laura Gultekin, Ph.D., FNP-BC, UMSN assistant professor, Michelle A. Meade, Ph.D., U-M Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation associate professor, and Matthew J. Smith, Ph.D., MSW, MPE, LCSW, U-M School of Social Work associate professor.

Poster sessions featured scholarly projects by UMSN students, faculty, alumni and research partners. Topics covered a wide variety of current nursing concerns such as medical cannabis for children, palliative care, stigma for people with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, postpartum care for people with opioid use disorders and inter-professional education.



RHO CHAPTER RESEARCH GRANT RECIPIENTS-PROJECT SUMMARIES

Each year Rho provides research grants to support members' scholarly work. This year's grant recipients and their project abstracts are presented here, as well as an update from last year's recipient:

Trauma & Violence in the Lives of Nurses: An Investigation of the Health and Occupational Effects of Trauma Experiences with the Nurses' Health Study (NHS) Data

Kristen Choi, PhD, RN. Co-investigators: Laura Sinko, Kathryn Abramoski, Nicholas Giordano, & Laura Britton

The purpose of this two-year study is to examine how trauma and violence experiences affect nurses, their health, and their work with a national sample of nurses. Nurses are routinely exposed to patients' experiences of pain, emotional distress, serious bodily injury, and death, which can put those with a preexisting trauma history at greater risk for secondary occupational trauma, burnout, and poor health outcomes. Secondary trauma may also negatively affect nurses' ability to provide pa-

tient care. However, there is very little evidence about the prevalence and impact of trauma and violence in the lives of nurses. This study will use the Nurses' Health Study II (NHS II) data—a national study of female nurses and their health—to investigate the prevalence and impact of childhood and adult trauma experiences on nurses, as well as risk and resilience factors where interventions can be targeted.

Hospital-to-Homecare Videoconference Handoffs Improved Communication, Coordination of Care, and Patient/family Engagement

The purpose of this project was to determine the feasibility and effectiveness of videoconference handoffs between inpatient, care management and

homecare nurses, and the patients/families during the transitions from hospital to homecare to improve communication and coordination of care. Videoconference handoffs were conducted for two months with patients transitioning from two pediatric inpatient units to the hospital-based homecare agency. The inpatient care management, bedside and homecare nurses, and patient/ family connected through a secure cloud-based videoconferencing platform. Using a checklist, participants discussed the patient's status, safety concerns, interventions, responses to treatment, plan of care, and what the patient/family could expect at home, as well as coordination of equipment/supply needs and post-discharge visits. Families (n=9) rated their experience as good/very good (89%). All reported it was reassuring to meet the visiting nurse, and questions/concerns were addressed. Nurses who participated in the handoff reported technology video and sound (76%), communication (96%), patient/family engagement (82%), ease of process (84%), overall experience (92%) were good/very good. The three pediatric visiting nurses received the information they needed and found coordination with the case manager helpful (100%). Post-pilot, all nurses and leadership stated the videoconference handoffs should continue with minimal modifications.
